

How to Obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) for a South Dakota Humanities Council Grant Application

In order to keep track of how federal money is disbursed, the federal government requires all recipients of federal money to register for a **Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)**. Previously, the government required DUNS numbers, administered through Dun & Bradstreet, for this same purpose. As of April 4, 2022, the government has replaced the DUNS number requirement with the UEI requirement.

Because the South Dakota Humanities Council (SDHC) provides federal money for grantmaking, we require all grant applicants to obtain a UEI and submit it as part of their application.

INSTRUCTIONS:

To apply for a humanities grant from SDHC, you will need to enter your organization's UEI on the online application. If your organization doesn't yet have a UEI, don't worry! We have provided instructions below to obtain your UEI (a free process). Please read through the three options below and pick the one that best suits your organization's situation. - **Option 1**: If your organization has already registered for a UEI, enter it in the indicated field on the online application. You're all set!
- **Option 2**: If your organization does not have a UEI in your records, but has registered in SAM.gov before, your organization has already been assigned a UEI. You can view it by logging in to SAM.gov and viewing your entity registration record.

 - Once you have obtained your UEI, enter your organization's UEI in the indicated field on the online application. That's it!
- **Option 3**: If your organization has not signed up for a UEI and is *not* registered in SAM.gov, follow the instructions beginning on *Page 2* of this document. Once complete, enter your organization's UEI in the indicated place on the online application. All done!



GLOSSARY OF TERMS:

- Login.gov is a website that provides a simple, secure, and private way for the public to access government websites. With one account and password, users can securely sign in to participating government websites and securely verify their identity. SAM.gov uses Login.gov for authentication.
- **Registration in SAM.gov:** Registration in SAM.gov is a separate process from requesting a Unique Entity Identifier. Registering in SAM.gov is not necessary for obtaining a Unique Entity Identifier, **however it is necessary for applying for a South Dakota Humanities Council grant.**
- **SAM.gov** stands for System for Awards Management. SAM.gov is an official website of the U.S. Government. There is **no cost** to use SAM.gov. The website SAM.gov can be used to
 - Register to do business with the U.S. Government
 - Update, renew, or check the status of your entity registration
 - Obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
 - o Search for entity registration and exclusion records
 - Search for assistance listings (formerly CFDA.gov), wage determinations (formerly WDOL.gov), contract opportunities (formerly FBO.gov), and contract data reports (formerly part of FPDS.gov).
 - View and submit BioPreferred and Service Contract Reports
 - Access publicly available award data via data extracts and system accounts
- **Subawardee:** In the context of SDHC's grantmaking program, our grant recipients are known to the federal government as "subawardees."
- **UEI** stands for Unique Entity Identifier. This unique number is generated by SAM.gov and is the federal government's system of keeping track where its money is allocated. The UEI is a requirement to receive SDHC grants after April 4, 2022, and it is free and quick to obtain.

If you would like to follow written instructions: To obtain a UEI, take the following steps:

- 1. Go to <u>SAM.gov</u> and select "Sign In" from the upper right corner of the page. SAM.gov uses Login.gov for authentication.
 - a. If you already have an account through Login.gov, sign in.
 - b. If you do not, create a sign-in through Login.gov by following <u>these instructions</u>. After you have created an account, sign in to SAM.gov.



2. After you sign in, the system will navigate you to your Workspace. On the "Entity Management" widget, select the "Get Started" button.

	An entity registration allows you to bid on government contracts and apply for federal assistance. As part of entity registration, we will assign you a Unique Entity ID (SAM).

- Select the checkbox near the bottom of the page to allow public viewing of your entity information in SAM.gov. If you deselect the checkbox, only you and federal government users will be able to view your Unique Entity ID (SAM) record. Other entities and users of SAM.gov (such as SDHC) will not be able to view your Unique Entity ID (SAM) record.
- You will be asked to certify that you are authorized to conduct transactions on behalf of your entity. Select the checkbox to certify, then select the "Request Unique Entity ID" button.

Publicly viewable entity records display your record status, legal business name, and physical address on SAM.gov. If you feel the public display of your entity information poses a security threat or danger to you or your organization, you can restrict the public viewing of your record in SAM.gov by deselecting the checkbox.
If you choose to restrict your information, it will not be visible to other non-federal entities or state and local governments who may wish to do business with you. However, your non-sensitive entity information remains available to federal government users. Learn more about SAM.gov public search results.
